
In Kenya, we continued assembling, distributing, and custom-fitting wheelchairs at our Centre, along with conducting outreach distributions across the country. As part of our programmes, we continued to provide vital rehabilitation services for children in need and expanded our *Reusable Diaper Project*.

We completed another major distribution in Uganda and continued our *Monitoring, Evaluation & Repairs**Project together with our local partners, following-up with past beneficiaries and addressing service gaps.

In Haiti, despite the ongoing unrest, we continued supporting people with mobility disabilities, distributing wheelchairs across the country with the help of 45 local partners. In 2023, we also travelled to Ghana thanks to the support of a generous corporate partner, to deliver 175 wheelchairs to those in need.

Every day, we are reminded of the collective effort that makes our mission possible. None of what we have achieved would be possible without our incredible UK and Kenya teams, our suppliers and partners around the world, and, of course, the generosity of supporters like you. From the bottom of our hearts, we thank you for continuing on this life-changing journey with us.



THE SHIRLEY RYAN ABILITYLAB

Since inception, Walkabout Foundation has been a part of some of the biggest breakthroughs in the field of Spinal Cord Injury (SCI) research. Finding a cure for paralysis remains at the heart of our mission. Since 2010, we have been dedicated to advancing cutting-edge SCI research and have proudly contributed over **\$1.9 million** to support these ground-breaking efforts.

In 2023, we strengthened our commitment by continuing our partnership with the *Shirley Ryan AbilityLab*, disbursing another \$100,000 to support their research study, "Functional Restoration after Spinal Cord Injury by Hebbian and Transcutaneous Spinal Stimulation". This study involves 15 participants with SCI and uses Hebbian and transcutaneous stimulation techniques combined with exercise, to promote the recovery of function. We are proud to support this innovative work that brings us one step closer to achieving our ultimate goal.



The outcomes of the study have been nothing short of extraordinary. Participants have shown remarkable progress, with several reporting improved motor function and some even regaining the ability to walk unaided. This research is not only paves the way for groundbreaking advancements in Spinal Cord Injury treatment, but also instills renewed hope in individuals affected by SCI, reaffirming our belief in the possibility of finding a cure for paralysis.

In 2023, we distributed over 1,570 wheelchairs from our *Wheelchair Assembly & Repair Centre* in Nanyuki, Kenya. This included one container of wheelchairs to Ghana, Uganda, and three outreach distributions across Kenya.

At our Centre, we continue to provide vital rehabilitation for up to **100 children**, alongside training for their parents and caregivers. Our Occupational Therapists equip caregivers with crucial home care skills, covering everything from feeding techniques to sleep positioning and exercise, aiming to ensure that every child has the best chance at a higher quality of life.

We expanded our *Rehabilitation Programme*, extending our services to a second location and scaling up our *Reusable Diaper Project*, having produced over **250 diapers and 300 sanitary pads**.

Our team manufactures these products locally at our Centre and provides them during outreach distributions and to individuals visiting the Centre. In addition, we held several workshops for caregivers, teaching them how to make their own diapers and pads, empowering them with sustainable solutions.



KENYA

CHANE'S STORY

Chane is a 5-year-old boy from Kenya. He has Spina Bifida and has never been able to move around independently.

In 2023, Chane visited our Centre in Nanyuki, where he was fitted with his first-ever paediatric wheelchair, designed to provide postural support. Thanks to his new chair, he finally has the dignity, freedom and independence that every child deserves. He can now move around with ease and he's very excited to go to school and play with his toys using the tray attached to the chair.





STEFANIE'S STORY

Stefanie is an 11-year-old girl from Kenya. She lives in rescue housing, where she receives rehabilitation support. Before Walkabout's donation, she didn't have a wheelchair of her own and had to share one with the other children at the home.

Our local team gave Stefanie her own wheelchair, custom-fitted to her needs. Now, she can be a lot more independent, continue going to school easily, make new friends and be a part of the local community.

MONITORING, EVALUATION & REPAIRS PROGRAMME

What began as a single distribution, has turned into a holistic, sustainable programme that continues to change hundreds of lives every year. We assess the impact of our wheelchairs and trikes, gathering data on quality of life, social inclusion, education and employment. This approach is amplifying our impact and creating lasting change in the communities we serve.

AGNES' STORY

Agnes lives in the Bidi Bidi refugee settlement in northern Uganda. She is one of many people displaced from neighbouring South Sudan due to the civil war. She has hydrocephalus, and therefore is unable to walk.

We provided Agnes with her first-ever wheelchair, and it has transformed her life. Thanks to her new chair, Agnes can finally attend school, go to the hospital for treatment, and travel around her community. Her brother helps push her home from school, and they can now navigate their surroundings with ease.



GHANA

CHAIRS DISTRIBUTED DISTRIBUTED

In May 2023, the Walkabout Team returned to Ghana for the first time since 2012 to distribute 175 custom-fitted wheelchairs to people with mobility disabilities. For this distribution, we worked together with our local partners, Orthopaedic Training Centre (OTC) and Kabaka Foundation. This wheelchair distribution wouldn't be possible without the support of Tullow Ghana Limited.

We would like to thank our donors and our local partners, for helping us change so many lives and restore dignity, freedom and independence to people with mobility disabilities in Ghana.







AFIYA'S STORY

Afiya is a 42-year-old woman from Ghana. She contracted Polio at the age of one, which left her unable to walk. Before receiving her new wheelchair from Walkabout, Afiya had been using an an old broken one, which made it difficult for her to move around.

As a petty trader, Afiya now finds her work much easier, as she can go to the market independently to gather the supplies she needs. Beyond her work, she is excited to be able to attend social gatherings with friends and go to church more easily, bringing her a renewed sense of freedom and connection to her community.



HAITI

1,216

We distributed **1,216** wheelchairs from our *HHA Walkabout Wheelchair Distribution Centre* in 2023, impacting **3,100** lives. We worked with over 40 local partners to deliver wheelchairs from our Centre to people with mobility disabilities across the country. Since establishing new partnerships with organisations such as Partners in Health and Médecins Sans Frontiers, we have been able to increase the number of wheelchairs distributed across the country.

Despite the challenges in Haiti, we remain committed to continue supporting people with mobility disabilities in the region.

HENRY'S STORY

Henry is a 40-year-old man from Haiti. He lives with his sister, who takes care of him. Prior to receiving a wheelchair, he used a plastic chair as a walker. Henry's mobility was limited, which meant he was unable to go to school or get a job.

The local team in Haiti gave Henry his first-ever wheelchair from our Centre. The chair not only changed Henry's life, but also his sister's, as he no longer has to rely on her to do daily tasks, reducing her caregiving responsibilities. Thanks to his new chair, Henry can move around his home with ease and explore his neighbourhood with a renewed sense of freedom and independence.









INDIA

CHILDREN IN PROGRAMME

We continued to provide rehabilitation, education and care to **40 children** with mobility disabilities at our *JJ Walkabout Centre* in Varanasi. Our services include physiotherapy sessions, skills training and education. We also continued our *Mother Training Programme*, designed to support mothers of children with disabilities and equip them with the necessary tools and knowledge, ensuring that the kids enrolled in our rehabilitation programme continue making progress in their development.



NANDHINI'S STORY

Nandhini is a 9-year-old girl from India. She was diagnosed with spastic Cerebral Palsy at a young age.

Before joining our Centre in 2017, she was unable to sit and had limited hand function. Since then, her progress has been remarkable! Today, she can sit and stand without support, and has developed the ability to grasp and hold different objects. Nandhini now performs her daily activities with minimal support, marking significant improvements in her independence.







UKRAINE

CHAIRS DISTRIBUTED



In 2022, we launched our #Walkabout4Ukraine campaign to raise funds for sending a container of 100 wheelchairs and mobility assistive devices to Lviv. Working together with our partner, Momentum Wheels for Humanity, we aimed to provide support to people affected by the war in Ukraine. Given the logistical complexities, the container arrived in 2023. Thanks to the support of Bloomberg Philanthropies and our community fundraising, we were able to help dozens of Ukrainian families and support a nation in need.





ARTEM'S STORY

Artem is an 8-year-old boy from Brovary, Kyiv. He has Cerebral Palsy, and therefore has never been able to walk. After being forced to evacuate due to the ongoing conflict, his family struggled ith the lack of support for Artem's disability.

In March 2023 Artem received a paediatric wheelchair specially tailored to his needs. His new wheelchair allows Artem to sit comfortably and helps him maintain proper posture. His family has enrolled him in a rehabilitation programme, and Artem can finally start school.

In 2023, we received support from several corporate partners, including Euromonitor International, Bloomberg Philanthropies and Tullow Oil. Through these partnerships, we have been able to create a lasting impact, transforming countless lives of people with mobility disabilities across the globe.



Euromonitor International has been supporting us as their Headline Charity Partner since 2017. Two of Euromonitor's employees, Philip Bush and Jordon Crimmins, ran the 2023 London Marathon in honour of Walkabout, fundraising to provide mobility to those in need. Thanks to their efforts, and Euromonitor's matched funding, they raised enough for 34 life-changing wheelchairs.

With Euromonitor's support, we have been able to expand our impact in Uganda, going beyond wheelchair distributions to follow up with previous beneficiaries and provide essential repairs. Together, we have changed countless lives in Uganda.

The sale was a tremendous success, raising over £58,000 for our projects!
